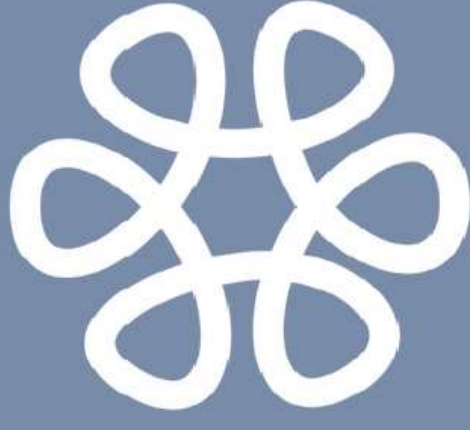

Foundational Training

An Integrated Health Response to Family, Domestic, and Sexual Violence, and Child Sexual Abuse

Foundational sessions guide primary health clinicians on understanding the scope and health impacts of Domestic Violence, Sexual Violence and Child Sexual Abuse. The sessions support practitioners to develop responses within the scope of their role, including understanding DFSV, its prevalence, as well as how to identify signs in practice, sensitively make enquiries, and provide effective responses including referrals to specialist services.

Session length:

- Two Hours: Able to be delivered in 2 parts (as two 1-hour sessions)
- **CPD eligible (hybrid session)**
- Can be extended to include a practical case study review.

Extension Modules

For staff that have completed foundational training: 1 hour per session (CPD Hybrid sessions).

1. DFV Information Sharing and Documentation (DFV)

Understanding state-based legislation and inter-agency responses to DFV.

2. Spotlight on Coercive Control (DFV & SV)

Supports understanding of how Coercive Control can present and impact well-being and safety.

3. Effects on Children (DFV & CSA)

Understanding effects of DFV and Child Sexual Abuse on children and the broader family impacts.

4. Management of Non-Fatal Strangulation (DFV & SV)

Understanding strangulation as a high-risk indicator and recommended clinical responses.

5. Child Sexual Abuse: Understanding Mandatory Reporting (CSA)

Understanding state-based legislation and mandatory reporting requirements for health practitioners.
