This activity aims to improve support and training available to GPs to treat drug and alcohol addiction.

Description of Activity *

The Royal Australian College of General Practitioners (RACGP) and the Australian College of Rural and Remote Medicine (ACRRM) have been funded by the Commonwealth to improve support and training available to GPs to treat drug and alcohol addiction. The GP Colleges have developed a training package which will be delivered through grants to GPs interested in pursuing training. Priority will be given to GPs practicing in geographic locations with populations that experience relatively increased rates of alcohol and other drugs concerns.

Brisbane South PHN will also commission additional resources to support a whole of general practice approach to working with people experiencing alcohol and other drug concerns, designed for other general practice team members such as practice managers and reception staff.
