AN INTEGRATED HEALTH RESPONSE TO DOMESTIC AND FAMILY VIOLENCE (1 HOUR)

In this foundational training you will develop a deeper understanding of Domestic and Family Violence (DFV) and how this presents in the primary health care setting. This training provides a model for primary care staff to recognise the signs of DFV, respond in an appropriate way and refer the person to the right supports.

SPOTLIGHT ON COERCIVE CONTROL (1 HOUR)

This additional learning module examines coercive control as an insidious pattern of behavior designed to entrap, isolate and disempower victim-survivors of DFV. This training outlines the role of general practice to identify behaviors and presentations that indicate a patient could be experiencing coercive control as part of a pattern of DFV.

ADDITIONAL TRAINING MODULES

DFV INFORMATION SHARING AND DOCUMENTATION (1 HOUR)

This training provides an overview of the DFV Information Sharing Guidelines and how general practice staff can work in an integrated way to respond to DFV.
